School Partnership

Partnership is central to our school's philosophy. Parents, staff, students and our Le Chéile Trust all have a role to play in the life of our school.

The Parents' Association

The school has a small but active Parent's Association that supports all aspects of school life and development. It meets on a monthly basis and consults with the principal on many aspects of school life. Two parents are nominated to serve on the Board of Management.

The Student Council

The Student Council is the voice of the student body in St Louis. They are led by the Head Girl and Deputy Head Girl and a small group of sixth year students. They meet regularly with the Principal and play a key role in the development of school policies. These senior Council members then meet with the rest of the Student Council and matters of concern are raised which can be brought to the principal at the next meeting. These girls are the representatives of the whole student body at all formal school occasions.

Board of Management

The school is managed on behalf of the Le Chéile Schools Trust and the Department of Education and Skills by a Board of Management.

The Board is comprised of two parent nominees, two staff nominees, and four members nominated by the Le Cheile Trust, one of whom represents the St Louis Sisters.





THE SCHOOL CREST

The school crest strongly reflects the French heritage and core values of the Sisters of St Louis, our founding congregation. The congregation was founded in the aftermath of the French revolution, a time of deep civil division and mis-trust in Europe. The founders looked to Saint Louis, a famously devout Catholic King of France from 1226-1270. The blue colour is the French blue of St Louis. The red hand of Ulster and the tower of the town of Monaghan represents the first sisters who travelled from Paris to Monaghan in the 19th Century and who were later invited to open a similar school for girls in Dundalk. The Fleur-de-Lys is another strong symbol of France while the sword and crown of thorns represent the crucifixion of Christ and later crusades by St Louis.

The Latin motto "Ut Sint Unum" means "That they may be one" a vision of hope for an end to division. While the old French motto "Dieu le Veult" is a prayer that God will hear the prayer for peace and understanding and make it happen, if he wills it. These traditional beliefs and aspirations still have an inherent value in a very divided modern world.
